Program Description:

As an increasing number of students with Autism Spectrum Disorder transition into college and university settings, it has become increasingly import for University and College Counseling clinicians to understand the unique nature of those students' experiences in order to support their successful completion of associate and/or undergraduate degrees. This presentation will help clinicians better understand the experience of students with Autism Spectrum Disorder while on college/university campuses, including clinical presentation and barriers to seeking assistance, general therapeutic interventions that have shown to be effective when working with this population, and provision of sensitive, supportive, and empowering clinical care.

About the Presenter:

Dr. Ylena Shayne (pronouns: she/her/hers) is a licensed clinical psychologist who has worked with college students at several university counseling centers and has provided clinical services within community mental health, outpatient, medical, assisted living, and group and individual private practice settings. She currently serves as a Senior Staff Psychologist and liaison to Disability Services Center at the UC Irvine Counseling Center, as well as serving as a private practitioner providing therapy to adults and couples in her private practice. Dr. Shayne's interest in working with individuals diagnosed on the Autism Spectrum began during her graduate training when she had the opportunity to develop and co-facilitate a drama therapy group for inpatient adolescents with co-morbid diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder, as well as provide individual therapy in an outpatient setting through The Help Group. As working with students diagnosed with ASD is often an overlooked clinical need on college campuses, Dr. Shayne actively sought out opportunities to work with students diagnosed with ASD after transitioning to University Counseling. Dr. Shayne has identified key therapeutic skills and expertise that are useful when providing care within short-term treatment models at college settings.
